



Cookie Policy

1. Definition

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that is downloaded on to your computer, smartphone or tablet, when you visit a website. Cookies are used to help a website remember information about your visit, which can make it easier when you visit the site again and make the site more useful to you. Cookies can do many things like remembering your preferences, recording what you have put in a shopping basket, or counting the number of people looking at a website.

2. Who is responsible for the personal data that we collect?

When you use our website to view the information we make available, a small number of cookies are used by us and by third parties to allow the website to function, to collect useful information about visitors and to help to make your user experience better.

Some of the cookies we use are strictly necessary for our website to function. Necessary cookies enable core functionality such as security, network management, and accessibility.

As well as the cookies we use, various third parties also place them on your computer. For example, we monitor user behaviour using Google Analytics in order to improve the site and review website traffic.

We do not place third party advertising cookies.

If you do not wish to receive cookies, you can disable them in your browser. However, this will lead to reduced site functionality.
