


Troubleshooting in Windows 10

Windows 10 contains many troubleshooting apps that you can easily run to diagnose and repair your PC and, depending on what is found, these offer automatic repairs or manual suggestions.

You can quickly get to the troubleshooters by entering "Troubleshoot" in the Windows Search box (on the task bar at the bottom left of the windows screen). This menu will pop up (Figure 1). Click on the item that is giving you trouble. The troubleshooter might display the problem and a solution.

Otherwise, go to Settings/Update & Security/Troubleshoot. If your problem does not appear, click on Additional troubleshooters. (Figure 2).

The complete Windows troubleshooting list is only available through Control Panel. To get to Control panel in Windows 10 you must write 'control panel' in the Windows Search box (on the left on the Task Bar) and click 'Enter'. This gives Figure 3.



If "Troubleshooting" is not listed, search in the Search bar on the top right of the panel. This gives



WINDOWS 11

Troubleshooting is similar in Windows 11, but looks a bit different.

Open "Settings", on the "System" page click "Troubleshoot"



If there are no problems listed and you want to check further, click on "Other trouble shooters" (ringed). This gives a list of individual troubleshooters and you can go down the list and click "Run" on any that you feel needs checking.
