

Islington U3A Leisurely Walks Group	
Walk/Distance	Part of the Dollis Valley Green walk 2.5 miles (about 1.5 hours walking)
Date/Time	Tuesday 4th October 2022 10.30am
Meeting up & travel	Woodside Park station (Northern Line) by 10.30am. Wait on platform on white bench or in waiting room. Do not cross over onto the s Return from Hendon Cemetery, stop N, bus 240 to Mill Hill East station or a 7 minute walk to Frith Court, stop E, and 382 bus to Finchley Central station.
Route & Terrain	At Woodside Park station there are steps up over the track to the eastern exit. Then pavement to Belarusian Memorial Chapel in Holden Avenue (the first wooden church built in London since The Great Fire and the fist memorial outside Belarus dedicated to the Chernobyl disaster). Good paths along Dollis Valley Greenwalk which is pleasant and peaceful and passes interesting allotments. Cross Dollis Road at Dollis Brook Viaduct. Level ground. Walk ends at Cake Create café opposite Hendon Cemetery.
Potential hazards	It may be bit muddy in places along the Dollis Valley Greenway if it has been raining.
Timing/breaks	Coffee 10.50 to 11.00am. Lunch, if desired, at Cake Create (not just cakes!) 12.15/12.30 depending on how long we spend having coffee or looking at the Belarusian Chapel. We are unlucky to be able to see inside on a weekday.
Clothing/footwear	Comfortable walking shoes and waterproofs/umbrella if necessary.
Toilets	Woodside Park station. Vero Café in Sussex Ring around 10.50am to 11am. Hendon Cemetery entrance opposite Cake Create in Holders Hill Parade at end of walk.
